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Dear High School Advisor:

In an effort to provide broader recognition for the most worthy efforts of our member schools, SCASC has established an Honor Council Recognition Program. This activity is not intended to be a competition among councils; rather, its purpose is threefold:

1. To set a standard for councils to work toward and evaluate themselves against.
2. To be a planning tool for advisors and student leaders to work with as they plan their year. This program can help you achieve a balanced year of activities.
3. A method whereby SCASC can effectively recognize quality councils within South Carolina.

The following pages contain a description of activities and services which your student council may wish to accomplish. Please note that points are given for each completed activity. Councils earning enough points will qualify for STANDARD, MERIT, or HONOR Councils, and will receive specially designed certificates indicating their specific recognition.

Certificate categories are as follows:

115-140 points - Standard (Bronze Award)

141-180 points - Merit (Silver Award)

181+ points - Honor (Gold Award)

You may download or print the file from the website (thegavel.org) and work on it throughout the year.

DEADLINE: Postmarked or e-mailed by February 17, 2020. Any application e-mailed or mailed after the deadline will not be considered. Also, applications that are not complete, (ie., initials missing, information sheets not completed or points not totaled) will be disqualified.

This program runs from spring 2019 to the following spring; thus, councils may include information from the previous year. If your council qualifies, you will receive your certificate during the Awards Ceremony at the State Convention in March. Please note that your school must be an active member of SCASC in order to participate.
