- Lead, serve and represent the state of South Carolina student councils with dignity, honor and class.
- Carry yourself in a manner that demonstrates respect for yourself, your school, your family and SCASC.
- Consider your actions so that what you do reflects a positive representation of the state and students you represent. This includes at school, at home, in the community, at conferences and on social media.
- To promote fairness during SCASC election campaigns, current SCASC officers will not endorse, like, follow or openly support any one candidate.

SCASC Historian

- 1. Elected at the state convention in March.
- 2. Create a digital scrapbook of all important SCASC Events.
- 3. Create a year-in-review video for the state convention.
- 4. Update the SCASC photo gallery.
- 5. Take pictures at all SCASC events.
- 6. Work closely with the president and executive director and help where needed.
- 7. Attend the <u>turnover meeting</u>. (Take notes and become familiar with the duties of the historian)
- 8. Attend and play a leadership role at the summer <u>Leadership Camp</u>.
- 9. If possible attend the NASC conference in June.
- 10. Attend the State convention planning meeting in December.
- 11. If possible attend the advisor/middle level workshop in January.
- 12. Attend and play a leadership role at the <u>State Convention</u> in March.

Note: Advisors must be committed to supervising, supporting, and helping the elected student to complete the task related to this position.
