Tracy Todd represented South Carolina as a finalist for the national advisor of the year and the delegation enjoyed a trip to Boston, where we visited the famous Faneuil Hall Market, took a Duck Tour, and attended a Red Sox baseball game.

Our summer camp this year was a success. The theme was "Expedition Leadership". The advisors and student officers worked well together to make camp a great learning experience for more than 180 delegates. The advanced student leaders in council X presented workshops and worked diligently to write our mission statement, our goals, and to create our new emblem. Thanks so much to Jami Reese Darling from Laurens District 55 High School for designing the new logo. I cannot express how much I appreciate the dedication of the senior staff. We were a little shorthanded with the senior staff members this year, but some past state officers stepped to lend a hand. With our awesome consultant, Chris Seifert from Pennsylvania, we explored the safari of leadership. Chris conducted three of the large group sessions, participated in council B, spent time talking one on one with students, and worked with our students, officers, and advisors. Chris taught, spoke, sang, and even did a little magic. I asked Chris to look at our camp and our organization as a whole and to make some recommendations for improvement. He left us with some really good suggestions, and I hope to implement some of them this year. One of his suggestions was to create an adult executive committee to help manage areas of our organization. I have already begun to appoint people for this committee. 


2017 Summer Leadership Camp News ...
